The death of a person with a terminal illness is not an emergency. Do not panic and do not call 911 . When you are ready, call the palliative care physician in charge of the deceased person’s medical care or the doctor or nurse who has been designated to come and pronounce death .

Terminal illness or end-stage disease is a disease that cannot be cured or adequately treated and is reasonably expected to result in the death of the patient. This term is more commonly used for progressive diseases such as cancer or advanced heart disease than for trauma.In popular use, it indicates a disease that will progress until death with near absolute certainty, regardless of treatment.
